



# MOTOR MUSTER 2025 CELEBRATES FORD THUNDERBIRD

Ford introduced a new idea in motoring for 1955. Thunderbird was a “personal car” combining sporty looks with luxury options. The first T-Birds of 1955-57 featured convertible tops and two seats, appealing to drivers who valued fun over function. Strong sales soared even higher when Ford added a back seat for 1958. Thunderbird continued over 11 styling generations, changing with the times but never losing its status as a car of distinction. Motor Muster celebrates Thunderbird’s 70th anniversary in 2025.
